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DATE & VENUE

The Judo competition of the 1st Caribbean Games 2022 will take place from Friday July 1 to Saturday July 2 at the Hall des Sport Paul Chonchon located in Pointe-à-Pitre, Guadeloupe.

EVENTS

The events announced for the 1st Caribbean Games Guadeloupe 2022 are as follows:

The medals will be awarded following the CANOC protocol regulations, and the official uniform representative of their country must be worn.

* In the case of the mixed team, physically six (6) gold medals, six (6) silver medals and twelve (12) bronze medals will be awarded.

COMPETITION FORMAT

Judo competitions will be held in two (02) days, with the competition taking place from the qualifying rounds to the medal contest for each weight category on the same day.

2 mat areas with each area divided into two zones: contest area and safety area. The contest area shall be a minimum of 8 m x 8 m and a maximum of 10 m x 10 m. The safety area shall be a minimum of 3 m. In case of two contest areas, a common safe zona may be used to satisfy the minimum distance of 4 m between them. A free zone of 50 cm minimum must be maintained around the entire competition area.

Depending on the number of participants in each category, the system is used:

- Round Robin (all against all) for five (5)
- Repechage for eight (8) athletes

In the repechage competition system, repechage will be starting at the quarterfinal. In each category, athletes will be divided into two (2) tables, determined by a draw. The elimination system will produce two (2) finalists who will compete for the gold medal. The athletes defeated in the quarter final will compete in two repechage contests. The winners of each of these two repechage contests will compete in bronze medal contests against the loser of the semifinal contest of the respective opposite table. The losers of this bronze-medal contest will place fifth (2), while the losers of the first repechage will place seventh (2).

The official weigh-in for each weight category will take place the day before, it lasts one hour. Half an hour before the official

weigh-in, the weigh-in place will be open, with the official scale so that the athletes can carry out the unofficial weigh-in.

On the day of competition there will be a random weigh-in of four (04) athletes per weight category except for the category “more than”, called “Random weigh in” where each athlete will be weighed again, with a margin over its official competition weight of 5%; This weigh-in will take place 1 hour before the start of the championship and lasts 45 minutes. Any athlete who does not pass the official weigh-in or 5% will be eliminated from the competition.

QUOTA

According to the quota established by CANOC, the judo competition will have a maximum of eighty (80) as follow:

ELEGIBILITY

To participate in this U21 Judo competition, athletes must be born between **Jan 1st 2002 and 31st December 2007**. To participate to the Caribbean Games 2022, each athlete needs to be part of a Judo federation affiliated to a NOC member of CANOC.

REGISTRATION

All countries, through the respective NOC, must send their Sports' registration applications in the official forms that the Organizing Committee will send in a timely manner no later than 00h.00 (Guadeloupe time) on **January 30, 2022**. The sports in which they will participate in the Caribbean Games "Guadeloupe 2022" must be indicated.

NUMERICAL REGISTRATION

All countries, through the respective Olympic Committee, must send their registration requests on the official forms which the Organizing Committee will send in due course.

The digital registration forms (indicating the number of participants in each: individual and team event) must be sent to the organizing committee of the 1st Caribbean Games Guadeloupe 2022 on or before the deadline date: before midnight (Guadeloupe time), **March 30, 2022**.

NOMINAL AND FINAL ENTRIES REGISTRATION

For each eligible athlete to participate in the 1st Caribbean Games Guadeloupe 2022, a nominative registration form must be completed.

These forms must be completed by the NOCs and sent to the organizing committee before midnight (Guadeloupe time) **May 30, 2022**.

Each NOC will have to send its digital entry and personal entry forms on the official forms provided by the organizing committee, which will be sent 6 months before the Games (Jan 2022). PARTICIPATION

Only the NOCs recognized by CANOC can register athletes in the Judo competition of the 1st Caribbean Games, Guadeloupe 2022.

They will be allowed to present a maximum of 6 judokas, one (1) per category. Considering the maximum number of athletes (80), some categories may not have enough judokas to hold a competition.

If, after consulting with all national federations, the maximum quota is not reached, the Pan American Judo Confederation, the LOC and CANOC will select the best judokas available, without considering the rule of 6 judokas maximum per country.

EVENT

There will be one **(1)** male competition and one **(1)** female competition of Judo.

AWARDS

The prizes will be awarded in accordance with the regulations of CANOC Chapter XIX:

- a) To the winner, a gold medal and a certificate of participation
- b) In second place, a silver medal and a certificate of participation
- c) In third place, a bronze medal and a certificate of participation
- d) From fourth to eighth place, a certificate of participation

ANTIDOPING

The Caribbean Games Anti-Doping regulations are prepared by the CANOC Medical and Anti-Doping Commission in conjunction with the Caribbean RADO and reviewed by WADA.

ON-SITE SUPPORT

The Organizing Committee will bear the onsite logistic costs (accommodation, meals, transportation) of the delegations from **June 27 to July 4, 2022**.

Please contact us if you would like an earlier arrival /late departure so that we can help with your extra stay if necessary. Note that all additional costs before and after the dates that will fall under the responsibility of the CG 2022 are the full responsibility of your delegation.

PARTICIPATION AND REGISTRATION FEES

1. Delegation Registration Fee by Sport

Each NOC must pay LOC, twenty-five US Dollars (**25.00 USD**) per sport in which it shall participate in respect of rights of registration for the Games.

2. Registration Fee per Participant

Each NOC and Associate Member must pay LOC, five US Dollars (**5.00 USD**) per participant registered for the Games.

3. Fee for Accommodation and Food

Each NOC and AM must pay fifteen US Dollars (**15.00 USD**) daily as a fee for Accommodation and Food for each participant that will reside in the Village per member of its delegation. The days of stay shall be counted from the moment that each member checks into the designated Village up to the day of check-out.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS TO GET IN GUADELOUPE*

Foreign citizens can travel to the French Overseas Territories depending on their vaccination status and the health situation of their country.

To date, the classification of the country is as follows:

- "**Green**" countries / territories: countries / territories in which no active circulation of the virus is observed, and no variants of concern have been identified. These are the countries of the European area, to which are added Saudi Arabia, Australia, Bahrain, Brunei, Canada, Chile, the Comoros, South

Korea, Hong Kong, Japan, Jordan, Lebanon, New Zealand, Singapore, Taiwan, Ukraine, Uruguay, and Vanuatu.

- **"Orange"** countries / territories: countries / territories in which active circulation of the virus is observed in controlled proportions. These are all countries / territories that are not included in the lists of "green" and "red" countries / territories.
- **"Red"** countries / territories: countries / territories in which active circulation of the virus is observed with the presence of variants of concern. These are the following countries / territories: Afghanistan, South Africa, Algeria, Argentina, Bangladesh, Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Georgia, Indonesia, Iran, Maldives, Morocco, Mozambique, Namibia, Nepal, Pakistan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Russia, Seychelles, Suriname, Tunisia, and Turkey.

The control rules that are applied to travelers derive from common law and depend on the categorization of the country:

Ø for **"green"** countries, a negative **PCR test of less than 72 hours** or a **negative antigen test of less than 48 hours** is required for all passengers. In addition, IF you are NOT FULLY VACCINATED, you will also need a **7-day prophylactic isolation commitment**.

Ø for **"orange"** countries, a negative **PCR test of less than 72 hours** or a **negative antigen test of less than 48 hours** is required for all passengers. In addition, IF you are NOT FULLY VACCINATED, you will also need a **compelling reason, duly justified** according to a pre-established list, and a **7-day prophylactic isolation commitment**.

Ø for the "red" countries with high circulation of the virus, no resumption of traffic. The resumption of international air and sea links is linked to the commitment of companies (air and sea) to carry out checks on compliance with the conditions to be met by passengers before their departure.
